## Q: Who is eligible to participate in the Health Professional of the Year Awards 2024?

We encourage professionals from various disciplines and sectors to nominate their deserving colleagues who have made a significant impact in their respective fields.

## Q: Can I nominate someone for multiple award categories?

A: Yes, you can nominate someone for multiple award categories if they meet the specific criteria for each category. Please ensure that you provide relevant details and supporting information for each nomination to give the judges a comprehensive understanding of the nominee's achievements in each respective area. Each nomination will be evaluated separately for the award category it is submitted under.

## Q: Can I nominate myself?

No. Self-nominations will not be considered.

## Q: What is the deadline for submitting nominations?

A: The deadline for submitting nominations for the Health Professional of the Year Awards 2024 is midnight on **Wednesday 24 July 2024**. Please make sure to submit your nominations before this date to ensure they are considered. Late nominations may not be accepted.

## Q: How are the winners selected?

A: The winners of the Health Professional of the Year Awards are selected through a rigorous evaluation process. Once the nomination period ends, an expert panel of judges carefully reviews all the nominations received. The judges consider factors such as the nominee's contributions, impact, innovation, leadership, and dedication to their field. The judging process

involves a thorough assessment of the information provided. The final decision is based on the judges' collective expertise and consensus.

**Q: Can I attend the Health Professional of the Year Awards without being a nominee or friend/family of the nominee?**

**Q: What is the Administrator's Medal, and how will it be awarded to the overall Health Professional or Health Professionals of the Year?**

A: The Administrator's Medal is a special recognition within the Health Professional of the Year Awards, honouring exceptional individuals who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, dedication, and contribution to the field of health care in the Northern Territory. . The Administrator's Medal will be awarded to the overall Health Professional or Health Professionals of the Year. This means that the finalists from our individuals or a group of health professionals will be eligible for this esteemed recognition.

This prestigious medal is awarded by the Administrator of the Northern Territory.

**Q: How will the winner of the Administrators Medal be selected?**

The selection process for the Administrators Medal will involve a thorough evaluation of the finalists of the Health Professional of the Year Awards. The judges will consider the nominees' exemplary achievements, leadership qualities, impact on the community, and commitment to improving health outcomes. The recipient(s) of the Administrators Medal will be announced and presented with this distinguished honour during the awards gala dinner, alongside the category winners.
